What is Days for Girls?

Days for Girls International is a nonprofit organization dedicated to supplying lasting feminine hygiene products to girls worldwide. Girls often have to use whatever material they can find to use during their menstrual cycle, such as leaves, newspapers, and scraps of cloth. This can lead to infections, diseases, and ultimately, girls missing days of school and work. How can a country thrive when half its population is suffering from lack of resources?

How it Works

Teams of volunteers in communities and campuses come together to sew and assemble kits, as well as partner with local distributors to deliver the kits to girls all around the world.

- 1 Drawstring bag
- 2 Shields
- 8 Tri-fold pads
- 1 Travel-sized soap
- 1 Washcloth
- 2 Pairs of panties
- 1 Visual instruction sheet


