BACKGROUND:

- OCD consists of distressing obsessive thoughts and compulsions to reduce the distress
- Often broken into five dimensions: Obsessing,
 Washing, Checking, Neutralizing, and Ordering
- Disgust often predicts OCD symptoms and symptom severity, though little looks into what domains of disgust predict which dimensions of OCD
- Little research examines self-reported disgust alongside lab-induced disgust


METHODS

- 50 undergraduate and faculty participants from Carthage College
- 76.9% Female, 76.9% White, and 17.3% Hispanic or Latinx
- 8.1% self-reported anxiety diagnosis, 7.7% self-reported OCD diagnosis
- \circ M=20.73 years of age
- 2. Surveys include: OCI-R-15, DS-R, TDDS—Moral Subscale
- 3. Behavioral Avoidance Tasks (BATs) to measure disgust along four domains, including: Vomit (contamination disgust), used toilet paper (core disgust), bloodied bone (animal-reminder disgust), voodoo doll (moral disgust)
- 4. Participants completed the surveys, then went through four steps of each task, each with progressively increasing interaction

HYPOTHESES

- 1. BAT reported disgust will positively correlate with self-reported disgust
- 2. Animal-Reminder, Contamination, and Core will all predict Washing, Checking, and Ordering OCD
- 3. Moral disgust *may* predict Obsessing and Neutralizing OCD

The Disgust Domains and Their Relation to Obsessive-Compulsive Disorder Dimensions



While some BATs did correlate with self-reported disgust, we had no significant findings between in-vivo disgust and OCD. Self-reported Core disgust did predict Neutralizing OCD and Contamination predicted Washing.

MAIN FINDINGS:

- Correlation between Vomit and Contamination and Core disgust
- Correlation of Bone and Toilet Paper with Contamination
- Correlation of Voodoo and Moral disgust
- Ran four multiple regressions using all disgust domains to predict each OCD dimension
- No significance of disgust dimension on OCD domain in BATs
- Self-Reports
- Neutralizing significantly relates to Core
- Washing significantly relates to Contamination
- Hypotheses were partially supported

LIMITATIONS

- Stimuli may not properly assess their associated disgust domain
- Vomit overlaps with both Core and Contamination disgust
- Literature suggests overlap between Core and Contamination
- TDDS scale created in response to DS-R
- Non-clinical sample
- Mixed validation results for TDDS-Moral and therefore may not accurately assess some or all aspects of Moral disgust

FUTURE RESEARCH:

- Continued use and validation of potential BATs to assess disgust
- Gather clinical sample
- Examine just Moral disgust with OCD
- Further validation research on the TDDS and DS-R
